Mr. Carlos Adrian Rodriguez, of Mesquite, TX, passed away on Sunday, June 24, 2018 at the age of 39.

Carlos was born to parents Reymundo and Carlota Rodriguez on July 4, 1978 in Dallas, TX. He grew up as the youngest of four and attended Poteet High School. In 1999, he married his high school sweetheart, Heather Johnson.

He studied to become an EMT in 2004 and began his career with Greater Dallas. He went back to school to earn his Paramedic license. He successfully advanced up in ranks and held the prestigious position of Operations Supervisor with American Medical Response for the last couple of years.
